Introduction

Now, I have good news for you. Kishore Mahbubani is ready to deliver his keynote speech. I will not introduce Kishore in detail. He has become a bestselling author on some major themes related to the subject matter of this conference, regarding world politics. Maybe it is because I fell under his influence that I said yesterday morning things which were perhaps not totally appropriate about the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. I apologise; this is my own fault and is entirely the consequence of Kishore's arrogance. Kishore, I am very happy to introduce you.
