Prof. Qu is the President of China Institute of International Studies (CIIS).

He graduated from Beijing Foreign Studies University in 1982 and obtained his B.A. In 1985, he graduated from China Foreign Affairs University, getting a M.A. in history. He received his M.A. and doctorate in political science from the Paris Institute of Political Studies (Sciences Po) in 1988 and 1992 respectively. Since 1985, he has been teaching at China Foreign Affairs University, serving consecutively as Director of the Teaching and Research Section of China's foreign relations under the Department of Diplomacy, Deputy Dean of the Department of Diplomacy, Assistant to the President of the University, and vice-President of the University. He was also a professor and doctoral supervisor therein. His academic interest covers contemporary Chinese diplomacy, history of Sino-French relations and international politics.

Dr. Qu has published extensively on Chinese diplomacy and international relations, including books Years of Suspicion: Sino-French Relations from 1949 to 1955 and Fifty Years of China's Diplomacy, and dozens of papers in various academic journals.

From January 2006 to August 2009, he served as Minister in Chinese Embassy in France. From January 2010 on, he serves as the President of China Institute of International Studies.
