Peter Hill joined the Foreign and Commonwealth Office in 1998 after a short period as an academic at Oxford University focussing on human development and agriculture. Before taking up his current role in 2013 as Director of Strategy in the FCO, he worked in the Home Office where he was responsible for counter-terrorism and security policy, including the Government's review of counter-terrorism powers, interception and communications data. In 2010 he worked at the independent Chilcott Inquiry into the Iraq conflict. Between 2006-2009 he was in the cabinet of the European Trade Commissioner, where he was responsible for trade negotiations with South Asia, Africa, the Caribbean and Pacific regions and overseeing the Commission's FTA strategy. He has also worked on a range of security and multilateral issues in the FCO and overseas.
