

Antoine Rostand

Senior Advisor, Schlumberger



An engineer by training, Antoine joined Schlumberger in 1986 as a field engineer and spent the first years of his career working in Europe and Africa for major Oil and Gas companies.

After graduating from Ecole polytechnique, he completed the INSEAD MBA program in 1989 and a Finance program at IMD.

After 6 years spent with ICME, the leading strategy consultancy in Switzerland, he was made a partner by AT-Kearney in 1996.

Following the acquisition of AT-Kearney by EDS, Antoine was appointed CEO for EDS France, where he doubled the business in 3 years, from 2000 to 4000 staff, in a globally shrinking market post Y2K IT boom.

He rejoined Schlumberger in 2002, after the group purchased Sema to head the Consulting and System Integration Unit for Europe, a 6500 staff business unit of SchlumbergerSema.

Antoine is now a Senior Advisor at Schlumberger, after serving as President of Schlumberger Business Consulting, an independent business unit of Schlumberger that he founded in 2004. SBC reported to a board chaired with Schlumberger CEO and composed of independent Directors John Browne, Nader Sultan and Peter Senge.

In ten years, under Antoine's leadership, SBC became the largest Management Consultancy in the Upstream sector, and has just been sold to Accenture.

Antoine chaired the SBC Energy Institute, SEI, a leading, non-profit energy research group created by him in 2011 to promote a better understanding of current and future energy technologies needed for the energy transition to a carbon-constrained world. SEI has benefited from the support as board members of renowned energy industry experts such as Adnan Shihab-Eldin and Claude Mandil.
