Karl Kaiser is Senior Associate of the Project on Europe and the Transatlantic Relationship, Belfer Center for Science and International Affairs. Adjunct Professor Emeritus at Harvard Kennedy School, he also taught at the Universities of Bonn, Johns Hopkins in Bologna, Saarbrücken, Cologne, the Hebrew University, and the Departments of Government and Social Studies of Harvard.

He was a Director of the German Council on Foreign Relations in Bonn and Berlin and an Advisor to Chancellors Brandt and Schmidt. He was a member of the German Council of Environmental Advisors. He is a recipient of the Atlantic Award of NATO and a member of the American Philosophical Society.

Professor Kaiser is the author or editor of numerous articles and books in the fields of world affairs, German, French, British and US foreign policy, transatlantic and East-West relations, nuclear proliferation.

He was educated at the Universities of Cologne, Grenoble and Oxford. He holds a Ph.D. from Cologne University and an Honorary Doctorate of the Russian Academy of Sciences.
