André Lévy-Lang

Member of the board of the French Institute of international relations (Ifri) Affiliate emeritus professor in Finance at Paris-Dauphine University



André Lévy-Lang graduated from Ecole Polytechnique in 1958 and holds a Ph .D. from Stanford University (1966). After two years as a research physicist with Commissariat à l'énergie atomique (CEA - the French atomic energy commission), André Lévy-Lang joined the Schlumberger Group in 1962 for which he held various engineering, marketing and management positions in France and the United States.

In 1974, he joined Paribas, a banking group, through one of its major affiliates, Compagnie Bancaire, the leading European group of specialised financial services companies. He was named CEO of Compagnie Bancaire in 1982. In 1990, André Lévy-Lang was named CEO of the Paribas group, a position he held until August 1999 when Banque Nationale de Paris (BNP) acquired Paribas to create BNP Paribas.

André Lévy-Lang is currently non-executive chairman of *Les Echos*, the business daily newspaper, and member of the supervisory board of Rothschild Martin Maurel. He chairs the Fondation du Risque and the Institut Louis Bachelier. He sits on the boards of the French Institute of International Relations (Ifri), of the American Hospital in Paris, of Institut Europlace de Finance and of Institut des Hautes Etudes Scientifiques.

He is an affiliate professor in Finance (emeritus) at Université de Paris-Dauphine.

He is the author of *L'Argent, la Finance et le Risque*, published by Odile Jacob (2006) and of *II faut maîtriser la finance*, published by Eyrolles (2012).
