Minister delegate for Foreign Affairs and Cooperation



Youssef Amrani was appointed the minister delegate for foreign affairs and cooperation by His Majesty King Mohammed VI in October 2013. He was the head of office of the secretary of state for the Arab Maghreb Union from 1989-1992. Afterwards, he was appointed as the consul general in Barcelona. Amrani has served as an ambassador to Colombia, Ecuador, Panama, Chile, Mexico, Guatemala, El Salvador, Honduras, Costa Rica, Nicaragua, and Belize. From 2003-2008, he served as the ambassador and director general of bilateral relations. In November 2008, Amrani was appointed secretary general at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Cooperation, a position he held until his election as secretary general of the Union for the Mediterranean, in July 2011. He has a degree in economics from the University Mohammed V in Rabat (1978) and graduated from the Institute of Management in Boston.
