

Masuda Tatsuo

Visiting professor at the NUCB Graduate School



Tatsuo Masuda is visiting professor at the Graduate School of Nagoya University of Commerce and Business (NUCB) on energy-climate nexus. He also serves as special advisor to SOC Corporation (a world leading manufacturer of micro fuse) in Tokyo, chairman of FairCourt Capital in London and strategic committee member of Elion House in Singapore.

He was professor at the Tokyo Institute of Technology on innovation and visiting professor at Paris University-Dauphine on energy geopolitics.

He has extensive careers in energy business, policymaking and research. He was advisor to Japan Petroleum Exploration Co. (JAPEX), vice president of Japan National Oil Corporation (JNOC) and the president of the Asia Pacific Energy Research Center (APERC). Prior to these, he was director of the International Energy Agency (IEA) in Paris. He was responsible for two core areas of the IEA (oil market and oil security) and supervised the production of the IEA Monthly Oil Market Report (OMR).

His professional career started in the Foreign Office of Japan as diplomat, then he joined the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry (METI), where he assumed several posts related with oil and energy policymaking.

He served as energy governor at the World Economic Forum (WEF) and still associates with the WEF as member of its Expert Network. He belongs to the International Panel of the Windsor Energy Group (WEG) as well as the Permanent Monitoring Panel on Energy of the World Federation of Scientists (WFS).
