

## **Marc Mourre**

## Director and founder of Mourre & Co Ltd



Marc Mourre is the founder of Mourre & Co Ltd, an advisory firm specialising in the oil, gas and Commodities industry since February 2016.

Until January 2016, Marc was Managing Director, Vice Chairman of the Commodities Division and Chairman of the African business effort for Morgan Stanley. He joined Morgan Stanley in 1986 and was responsible for setting up the London Commodities trading office. He moved to Singapore in 1990 to head the commodities trading and marketing operations until 1995 when he returned to London as Global head of Commodities marketing and business development.

Marc was Vice Chairman of Commodities with a focus on Emerging Markets specifically the Middle East and Africa. Marc was also Chairman of Institutional Securities cross divisional efforts across Africa where he was responsible for delivering a coordinated coverage effort across equity, fixed income, commodities, investment banking and capital markets. Marc overviewed the Senior and Strategic Commodities Relationship effort with all the Firm Clients in the Commodities space: Corporate, Equity Funds, Sovereign Wealth Funds and Governments.

Before joining the Financial industry, Marc worked three years for the French Ministry of Foreign Affairs as Cultural Attaché in Hong Kong, then he joined Elf Aquitaine (today Total) in the International trading oil division where he spent over four years as a crude oil trader.

He holds a Master of Sciences in business administration from Sup. de co. Marseille, a D.E.A in Business Administration from ESSEC/ IAE Aix en Provence and a D.E.S.S in international trade and transportation from Aix Marseille University. He received a Scholarship from FNEGE (Fondation Nationale pour l'enseignement de la Gestion) for various researches and was teaching International Finance at HEC for four years. He is Chairman of the Trustees of the Friends of the French Institute in London, "Chevalier des Arts et des Lettres" and "Chevalier de la Legion d'Honneur".
