Award-winning journalist Christopher Dickey is the author of seven books, most recently *Our Man in Charleston: Britain's Secret Agent in the Civil War South*. Former Paris Bureau Chief and Middle East Editor for *The Daily Beast*. Previously he held the same position with *Newsweek Magazine*. In the 1980s he worked for *The Washington Post* covering wars in Central America and the Middle East.

Dickey's books include *With the Contras: A Reporter in the Wilds of Nicaragua* (Simon & Schuster, 1986); *Expats: Travels from Tripoli to Tehran* (Atlantic Monthly Press, 1990); *Innocent Blood: A Novel* (Simon & Schuster, 1997); *Summer of Deliverance: A Memoir of Father and Son* (Simon & Schuster, 1998), and a second novel, *The Sleeper*, published by Simon & Schuster in September 2004.

Dickey has also written for *Foreign Affairs*, *Foreign Policy*, *Vanity Fair*, *The New Yorker*, *Wired*, *The New York Review of Books*, *The New York Times Book Review*, and *The New Republic*, among other publications. He is a frequent commentator on CNN, the BBC, France24, National Public Radio, and several other television and radio networks in the United States and abroad. His personal blog, *The Shadowland Journal*, provides links and sidelights to his many published columns, essays and articles.

Dickey is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations, where he was formerly an Edward R. Murrow Press Fellow; of the Overseas Press Club of America; and of the Anglo-American Press Association of Paris. He was formerly a visiting professor at the University of Sheffield in the United Kingdom.
