Rozlyn (Roz) C. Engel is a Nonresident Scholar in the Geo-Economics and Strategy Program at the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace, where she focuses on macroeconomic and institutional risk, economic dimensions of U.S. foreign policy, long-term economic trends shaping the global policy landscape, and estimative intelligence analysis.

Roz has spent more 15 years at the nexus of economics, global security, and U.S. policy development. From October 2016 to August 2018, Roz was the senior executive in charge of the Office of Macroeconomic Analysis in the U.S. Treasury Department. (From January 2017 onward, she also fulfilled the duties of the Deputy Assistant Secretary for Macroeconomic Policy and served as primary back-up to the Acting Chief Economist.) From 2013 to 2016, Roz was the National Intelligence Manager and National Intelligence Officer for Economics in the Office of the Director of National Intelligence, where she oversaw all economic analysis and drove strategic priorities on global economics across the U.S. intelligence community. Before ODNI, she was a Distinguished Research Fellow in Economics at the National Defense University and an Associate Professor of Economics at West Point, where she taught for more than eight years. Roz holds a PhD in Economics from Columbia University and a MSc in Economic History from the London School of Economics.

From her home base in the New York area, Roz also teaches economics at New York University and is a principal at Billingsgate Advisors, a strategic risk consultancy.
