Marius Stoian (b. 3 September 1970, Bucharest) is a publicist and writer with a Bachelor's degree in Journalism and Communication Sciences (1996).

He began his career in journalism in 1990, as editor of the newspaper Tineretul Liber, the second newspaper like number of printed-copyes in that age.

Later on, he worked as a correspondent for the daily newspaper Evenimentul Zilei in Budapest, Hungary, between 1993 and 1997, and for the daily newspaper Jurnalul National and the TV channel Antena 1 between 1998 and 2000, in Chisinau, Republic of Moldova.

He founded and managed publications such as Jurnalul National - the Chisinau Edition and Stirea zilei.

During his public service activity he was successively: personal advisor for the Secretary of State for the Romanians Abroad (2000) and for the Minister of Tourism (2001-2003). In 2009 he was also Under Secretary of State for Foreign Trade.

In the literary sphere, the year 2010 brought him the Award of the Writers' Association for 8215, a volume issued by the publishing house 22th Century Publishing.

At present, he has extended his preoccupations and studies in the field of international relations, in particular in the area of informal bodies: he is the President of Club Romania member of Chatham House, London, and also member of the Aspen Institute Romania. He regularly publishes materials of socio-political analysis of deep implications, having an exclusivity contract with Q Magazine, the most popular weekly in Romania.

At the end of the year 2011, he was included by the prestigious publication Foreign Policy in the Top 100 Romanians who can make things happen through ideas or the power of example.
