

Bertrand Deroubaix

Senior Vice President Public Affairs, Total



Bertrand Deroubaix, 61, is a graduate of France's Ecole Polytechnique and Ecole Nationale des Ponts et Chaussées, a civil engineering school.

He began his career in the French Transportation Ministry. He then took the responsibility of all public works (motorways, bridges, sanitation, buildings) for a territory of 400 000 inhabitants in northern France. In 1988, he became during 7 years the project manager for the Normandy Bridge across the Seine, a worldwide record of giant bridges.

He joined Total in 1995 as Deputy General Manager of the Normandy Refinery.

In 1997, he moved to the upstream segment, where he was Vice President, New Business & New Ventures at Total Gas & Power, then Vice President, Strategic Planning and Finances at Total Exploration & Production.

He was appointed Vice President e-Business and e-Procurement for the Group in 2000, and in 2002 was elected Chairman of the Board of Trade-Ranger, an e-procurement marketplace serving the oil and gas and chemical industry based in Houston.

In 2004, Bertrand Deroubaix was appointed Corporate Vice President, Competitive Intelligence.

In November 2008, he was appointed General Secretary of Total Refining & Marketing Division and joined the Corporate Management Committee of the Group.

In January 2012, he was appointed General Secretary of the new Refining and Chemical Division.

In September 2016, he was appointed Senior Vice President Public Affairs for France, Europe and worldwide public relations, as well as Regional Development and Competitive Intelligence of the Group.
