Roberto Burioni, MD, PhD, is Professor of Virology and Microbiology at the Medical School of the Università Vita-Salute San Raffaele in Milan, Italy.

He began his research activity at the Centers for Disease Control in Atlanta, Georgia and at the Wistar Institute of the University of Pennsylvania in Dr. Koprowski's and Carlo Maria Croce's laboratory.

From 1989 he was a visiting scientist at the Center for Molecular Genetics at the University of California, San Diego, and since 1991 he was a visiting investigator at the Scripps Research Institute, La Jolla, California, in Dr. Dennis Burton's laboratory.

In November 1995, he was appointed Assistant Professor at the Medical School of the Università Cattolica del Sacro Cuore, Rome. In 2004 he began as an Associate Professor at the Università Vita-Salute San Raffaele, Milano, where eventually was appointed Full Professor of Microbiology and Virology.

He is currently leading a lab active in the development of human monoclonal antibodies against human infectious agents and is the medical director of the site www.medicalfacts.it. He has published several books, many of them bestsellers for a correct scientific dissemination on the field of vaccines, infectious diseases and alternative medicine.
