We have also seen the development of new security threats – the Sahel, of course, is not a new security threat – in Eastern Africa, from Ethiopia in the north to Mozambique in the south, where Rwanda is very much involved, as well as many other problems on the continent with the possible interference of outside powers in the medium- to long-term.

These are the sorts of problems I have asked President Kagame to discuss with us tonight and I am very honored and happy to give him the floor for his presentation. After that, we will have a short discussion.
