Maybe, Christian, you would agree that there are regional epidemiological and response patterns to pandemics and we certainly need hubs to manufacture essential supplies, vaccines, diagnostic therapeutics, etc., in each region. We have to adapt our governance structure and work on preparedness and response culturally and politically to regional patterns.
