PRESS RELEASE

15th edition of the World Policy Conference December 9-11, 2022, Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates

Paris, France, November 25, 2022 - Founded in 2008 by Thierry de Montbrial, Chairman of the French Institute of International Relations (Ifri), the World Policy Conference (WPC) will be holding its fifteenth edition on December 9-11, 2022, in Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates.

Since its first edition in 2008, the WPC's mission has been to reflect upon and to come up with solutions to the constant upheavals of today's world and to create lasting bonds between the participants. This international conference gives a voice to political, economic, academic and media players from over 40 countries - from major powers to medium and small countries, including emerging countries, thus ensuring a diversity and plurality of debates.

In 2022, the city of Abu Dhabi will host the World Policy Conference for the second time.

FOUNDER AND CHAIRMAN



Thierry de Montbrial

Thierry de Montbrial is Executive Chairman of the French Institute of International Relations (Ifri), which he founded in 1979. He is Professor Emeritus at the Conservatoire national des arts et métiers. In 2008, he launched the World Policy Conference. He has been a member of the Académie des sciences morales et politiques of the Institut de France since 1992, and is a member of a number of foreign academies.

He serves on the Board or Advisory Board of a number of international institutions. Thierry de Montbrial chaired the Department of Economics at the École Polytechnique from 1974 to 1992. He was the first Chairman of the Foundation for Strategic Research (1993-2001). Entrusted with the creation of the Policy Planning Staff (*Centre d'analyse et de prévision*) at the French Ministry of Foreign Affairs, he was its first Director (1973-1979). He has authored more than twenty books, several of them translated in various languages, including *Action and Reaction in the World System - The Dynamics of Economic and Political Power* (UBC Press, Vancouver, Toronto, 2013) and *Living in Troubled Times, A New Political Era* (World Scientific, 2018). He is a Grand Officer of the Légion d'honneur, Grand Officer of the Ordre national du Mérite. He has been awarded the Order of the Rising Sun – Gold and Silver Star, Japan (2009), Commander of the Order of Merit of the Federal Republic of Germany (2016) and other state honors by the French and several foreign governments. Thierry de Montbrial is a graduate of the École Polytechnique and the École des mines, and received a Ph.D in Mathematical Economics from the University of California at Berkeley.



MISSION OF THE WPC



Founded in 2008, the World Policy Conference (WPC) is dedicated to helping promote a world that is more open, more prosperous and fairer. This requires an unremitting effort, to understand the actual forces at play and the interactions between them, as well as to explore non-aggressive ways of adapting how States connect with each other at all levels, while respecting the culture and fundamental interests of each nation.

The annual meeting of the WPC is restricted in size so that participants can create lasting bonds with one another. EDITION 2021

The fourteenth edition of the World Policy Conference (WPC) was held in Abu Dhabi from October 1 to 3, 2021. Like the previous ones, it brought together political and economic leaders, experts and opinion leaders who debated the global issues of the moment and global governance. The meeting was opened with a welcoming address by the Minister of Tolerance and Coexistence of the United Arab Emirates, Sheikh Nahayan Mabarak Al Nahayan, an introduction by Thierry de Montbrial, addresses by the Archbishop of Constantinople - New Rome and Ecumenical Patriarch, His Holiness Bartholomew I, by the Prime Minister of the Republic of Albania, Edi Rama, by the Prime Minister of the Republic of the Côte d'Ivoire, Patrick Achi, and messages from the Minister of Foreign Affairs of Saudi Arabia, Prince Faisal bin Farhan Al Saud, and from the Minister of Europe and Foreign Affairs of France, Jean-Yves Le Drian.


The eighteen plenary sessions were devoted to the challenges to global governance in areas such as: World Political-Economic Outlook After the Pandemic, Transatlantic Relations, The Middle East and External Powers, Stakes of Space Competition. Among the prominent speakers who contributed their insights were Stuart Eizenstat (former Ambassador of the United States to the European Union), Philippe Baptiste (Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of the French Centre for Space Studies), Peter Handley (Head of the Energy-Intensive Industries and Raw Materials Unit in the European Commission's Directorate-General for Growth), Carlos Moreira (Founder, Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of WISeKey, former UN Expert on cybersecurity), Marcus Noland (Executive Vice President and Director of Studies at the Peterson Institute for International Economics), Bogdan Klich (Senator in the Polish Parliament, Chairman of the Foreign and EU Affairs Committee in the Polish Senate), Mari Kiviniemi (Managing Director of the Finnish Commerce Federation, former OECD Deputy Secretary-General, former Prime Minister of Finland), Lionel Zinsou (Co-Chair of SouthBridge, Chairman of Terra Nova think tank, former Prime Minister of Benin), Ana Palacio (International Lawyer, former Minister of Foreign Affairs of Spain, former Senior Vice President and General Counsel of the World Bank Group), Josep Borrell Fontelles (High Representative of the EU for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy, Vice President of the European Commission), Kevin Rudd (President of the Asia Society Policy Institute, former Prime Minister of Australia).

The workshops focused on three main areas - Money and Finance, Energy, Climate and Sustainable Development, and Africa- from a global governance perspective. The discussions were particularly constructive, with participants such as Cheikh Tidiane Gadio (Vice President of the National Assembly of Senegal, President of the Pan-African Institute for Strategies, Peace-Security-Governance), Mariam Al Mheiri (Minister of Climate Change and Environment, United Arab Emirates), Lionel Zinsou (Co-Chair of SouthBridge, Chairman of Terra Nova think tank, former Prime Minister of Benin), Aminata Touré (Senegalese politician, former Prime Minister), Nardos Bekele-Thomas (UN Resident Coordinator in South Africa), Serge Ekué (President of the West African Development Bank), Jacques Michel (Chairman of BNP Paribas Middle East and Africa for Corporate and Institutional Banking), Isabelle Tsakok (Economist, Consultant on Agriculture and Rural Development, Senior Fellow at the Policy Center for the New South).

Around high-level personalities such Louise Mushikiwabo (Secretary-General of the International Organisation of La Francophonie), Paul Kagame (President of the Republic of Rwanda), et Khaldoon Khalifa Al Mubarak (Chairman of the Executive Affairs Authority, Group Chief Executive Officer and Managing Director of Mubadala), the lunch and dinner debates enabled numerous exchanges on topics such as: the role of the French-speaking world, the development of Africa, as well as the situation in the Middle East.


