Amb. Yim, now senior advisor at the Lee International, former President of the Korea Foundation from 2007 until 2010. Since joining the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in 1974, he has served in a number of major foreign service posts as a career diplomat, including those of ambassador to Canada (2004-2007) and Egypt (1996-1999). He also assumed the role of Executive Director, Headquarters of the Summit Preparation for the Asia Europe Meeting (ASEM) in 1999. In 2001, he served as Deputy Minister for Foreign Affairs, Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade (MOFAT) and in 2002, he was appointed as the National Security Adviser to President Kim Dae-jung. He formerly co-chaired the Korea-Canada Forum, an annual track two dialogue event between the two countries. He also participated in various Korea's dialogue forum including the US, the UK, Japan, Spain and the Middle East. He holds a bachelor's degree in international relations from Seoul National University in 1971, and he also engaged in graduate studies at the University of Oxford in the United Kingdom, as well as Keio University in Tokyo, Japan.
