17th edition of the World Policy Conference from Dec. 13 to Dec. 15, 2024, in Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates

Founded in 2008 by Thierry de Montbrial, Chairman of the French Institute of International Relations (Ifri), the World Policy Conference (WPC) will be holding its seventeenth edition on December 13-15, 2024, in Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates.

The city of Abu Dhabi will host the World Policy Conference for the fourth time, after three editions in 2021, in 2022 and 2023.

Since its first edition in 2008, the WPC's mission has been to reflect upon and to come up with solutions to the constant upheavals of today's world and to create lasting bonds between the participants. This international conference gives a voice to political, economic, academic and media players from over the five continents – from major powers to medium and small countries, including emerging countries, thus ensuring a diversity and plurality of debates. This conference aims to help everyone to have an enlightened reflection on the constant changes in the world today.

Founder and Chairman



Thierry de Montbrial

Thierry de Montbrial is Executive Chairman of the French Institute of International Relations (Ifri), which he founded in 1979. He is Professor Emeritus at the Conservatoire national des arts et métiers. In 2008, he launched the World Policy Conference. He has been a member of the Académie des sciences morales et politiques of the Institut de France since 1992, and is a member of a number of foreign academies.

He serves on the Board or Advisory Board of a number of international institutions. Thierry de Montbrial chaired the Department of Economics at the École Polytechnique from 1974 to 1992. He was the first Chairman of the Foundation for Strategic Research (1993-2001). Entrusted with the creation of the Policy

Planning Staff (*Centre d'analyse et de prévision*) at the French Ministry of Foreign Affairs, he was its first Director (1973-1979). He has authored more than twenty books, several of them translated in various languages, including *Action and Reaction in the World System - The Dynamics of Economic and Political Power* (UBC Press, Vancouver, Toronto, 2013) and *Living in Troubled Times, A New Political Era* (World Scientific, 2018). He is a Grand Officer of the Légion d'honneur, Grand Officer of the Ordre national du Mérite. He has been awarded the Order of the Rising Sun – Gold and Silver Star, Japan (2009), Commander of the Order of Merit of the Federal Republic of Germany (2016) and other state honors by the French and several foreign governments. Thierry de Montbrial is a graduate of the École Polytechnique and the École des mines, and received a Ph.D in Mathematical Economics from the University of California at Berkeley.

Mission of the WPC

Founded in 2008, the World Policy Conference (WPC) is dedicated to helping promote a world that is more open, more prosperous and fairer. This requires an unremitting effort, to understand the actual forces at play and the interactions between them, as well as to explore non-aggressive ways of adapting how States connect with each other at all levels, while respecting the culture and fundamental interests of each nation.

The annual meeting of the WPC is restricted in size so that participants can create lasting bonds with one another. It brings together leading figures from all five continents – political and business leaders, academics and journalists – in a spirit of tolerance that is the only one conducive to the pursuit of the common good. Beyond the participants, this meeting aims to help all populations affected in a time of constant upheaval.

EDITION 2023

The sixteenth edition of the World Policy Conference (WPC) was held in Abu Dhabi from November 3 to 5, 2023. Like the previous ones, it brought together political and economic leaders, experts and opinion leaders who debated the global issues of the moment and global governance.

The meeting was opened with a welcoming address by the Founder and Executive Chairman of Ifri and the WPC, Thierry de Montbrial, and an address by Noora Al Kaabi Minister of State of the United Arab Emirates and a message of Emmanuel Macron, President of the French Republic, delivered by Laurence Boone, Secretary of State for European Affairs of France.

Twenty plenary sessions

The plenary sessions were devoted to the challenges to global governance in areas such as geopolitics and geoeconomics, the future of EU and European security after the Ukraine war, AI governance, global governance and public health as well as food security.

The workshops focused on three main areas – Finance and Economy, Energy and Environment, and the Economic and Social Issues in the Middle East. Dinner debate

Around Kevin Rudd (Australia's Ambassador to the United States, former Prime Minister of Australia) the dinner debate enabled numerous exchanges on topics such as the future of US-China relations or the relations between China and Middle-East powers.
